

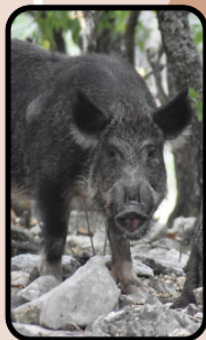
INTEGRATED WILDLIFE DAMAGE MANAGEMENT:

VULTURES

Mikayla Killam, Wildlife Damage Program Specialist, from the Department of Rangeland, Wildlife, and Fisheries Management, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service, will discuss the two vulture species found in Texas, their basic biology, the ecosystem services they provide, and the damage they can cause in both rural and urban environments. She will cover the laws and regulations surrounding migratory birds so that attendees can ensure their management efforts do not violate any laws. The program will provide management tools and how they can be safely and correctly implemented as part of an Integrated Wildlife Damage Management plan to produce the best results.

MANAGING FERAL HOGS: Basics of Wild Pig Management

In this class, Mikayla will cover the origins and biology of feral hogs in order to better understand how to manage them. She will discuss the impacts that feral hogs have on the environment, wildlife, agricultural practices, and humans in general. In this class, you'll learn methods for identifying feral hog activity on a property through damage, tracks, and scat as well as the importance of an integrated pest management approach and how it applies to managing feral hogs. Specific management tools to be covered include: trapping (with a wide variety of options and combinations), shooting, aerial gunning, snares, dogs, and chemical control.
